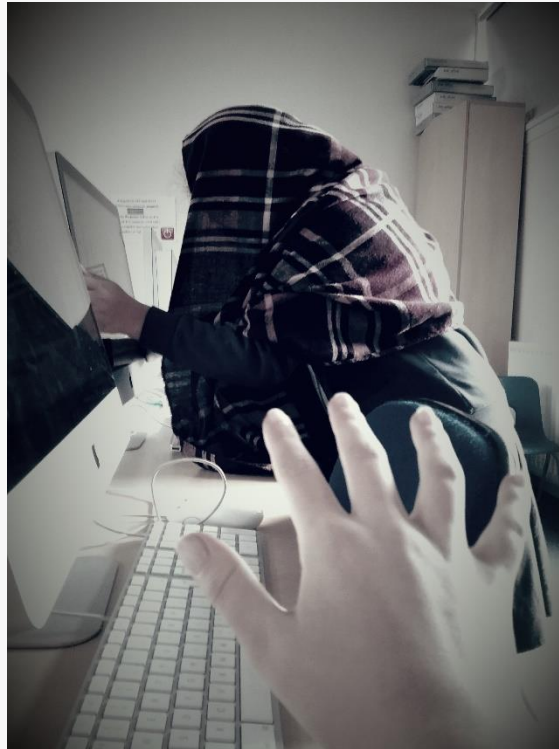

On Monday 26th February, Year 1 were told to look after unhatched ducklings for a few weeks until they were hatched and healthy.

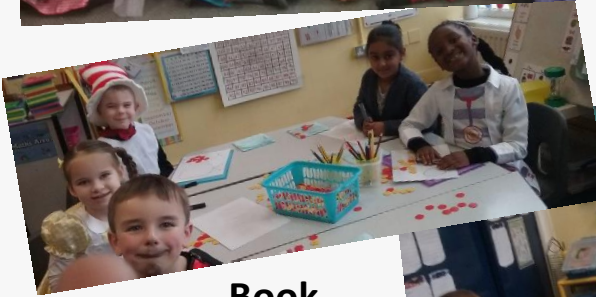
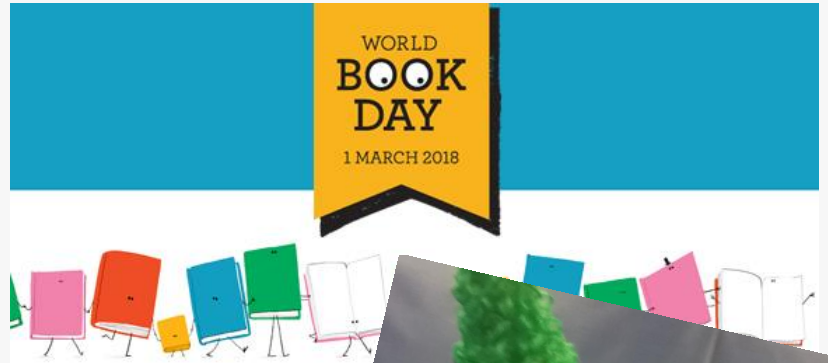

There were various activities that occurred around the school from scavenger hunts and the Biggest Book Show on Earth to games like 'Match the Shelfie to the Selfie'

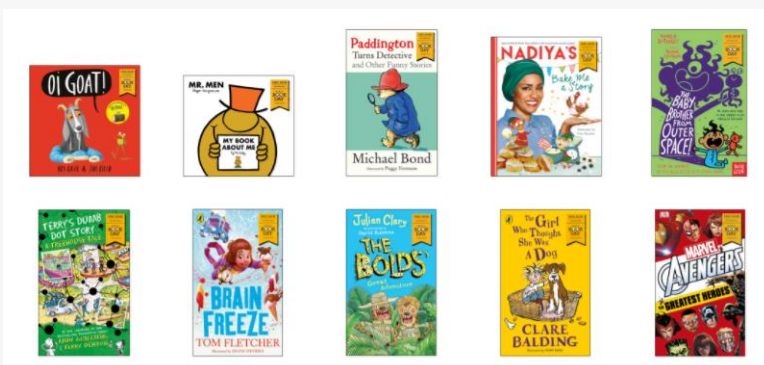
In the afternoon we invited our families in to share stories with us!

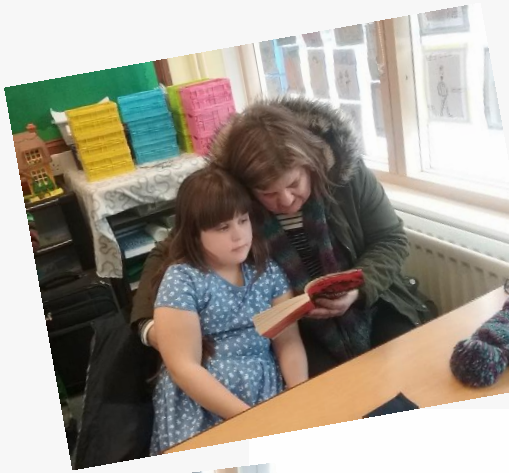

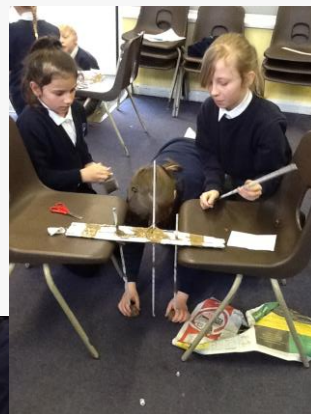
Acting as atoms with Atomic Tom
