Reading Challenge Launched

By Year 4

Tuesday 17th July saw the school gathering in the hall for a special assembly, about the Summer Reading Challenge 2018.

This year's theme is Mischief Makers because we are celebrating the 80th anniversary of the Beano!

To take part you have to go to the library (you need to be a member which is free and easy to do!) At the library when you register your interest you will be given a map. You then need to choose 2 books – of any type you find interesting.

When you have completed those books, return them to the library and you will be awarded some stickers with clues to help you find the treasure buried in Beano Town. The stickers are scratch and sniff for added excitement!

Then you can choose another 2 books and so on. You have to read 6 books in total to finish the challenge. Once you have finished you will get a gold medal, a certificate and a wrist band.

Year 3 and 4 also created their own Mischief Makers which will be on display in the Banbury Town Library.



As part of this challenge we are also doing a summer sponsored read. Children who read over the summer can ask their families and friends to sponsor them for what they read...They can read magazines, newspapers, books, comics, websites, recipes, Kindles...anything that uses their reading skills!

The money raised by each child will be collected in on the first week of term and used to but NEW books for their NEW classroom.

So if you want NEW comics or David Walliams books or Diary of a Wimpy Kid or non-fiction books or atlases or adventure books in your class **you better get reading!**

Colbey stated "I think the teachers there will be really supportive".


We wish them lots of luck and look forward to finding out how they get one!
