
Newsletter

Please ensure that you let the office know of any change in the collection arrangements for your child or children.


In the interest of safeguarding we will only let children go with known adults.

This week has been 'Citizens of the World Week' here at St Joseph's. The children in KS1 and KS2 have enjoyed learning about aspects of other world religions: Judaism, Islam, Sikhism and Hinduism.
