Dear Parents & Carers,

I would like to begin by thanking the teaching teams in Years 4 & 3 for the thoughtful enacting of the Stations of the Cross that we have been guided through this week. The children prepared and presented the Stations with great reverence and bravely took up the challenge of the outdoor setting. Tuesday was kind to us, but I'm afraid we had to abandon the school field for the school hall on Wednesday due to sudden torrential rain which then cleared into bright blue skies by the time the children had begun – all very typical of April of course! A big thank you to the parents who came that day and helped to get chairs and staging set up so quickly and for your understanding of the situation as well. It was very much a family affair! The Stations of the Cross also formed our liturgy for the end of the term for the whole school, so very well done LKS2!

Thank you for your generosity in our Lenten charitable work. The envelopes for Father Hudson Care are still coming in and so we shall announce the amount we have raised after Easter. You were very generous on our Sunflower Day for Ukraine and we raised £425 on that one day even though we had only asked for £1 per family. We are very conscious that rising prices of energy and food are providing many challenges so thank you for your generosity. The money has been sent to CAFOD to support the humanitarian relief effort in Ukraine.

Next week is Holy Week. We have reminded the children about the significance of this and I am also sending a short explanation of the significant days in this week so that you can talk about these with your children. Please refer to the times of the services in the Parish Churches so that you can mark the great Feast of Easter with your children by attending, at least on Easter Sunday.

Thank you to the team of parents and children who came to help last Saturday for our Big Spring Clean Day. The team was small but highly skilled and I am sure you will have noticed the difference in our planting at the front of the school and in the classroom planters, as well as in some other repair jobs around the grounds. Over the Easter holidays our new EYFS fence will be put in which will help to improve the playground environment still further. We also have an exciting whole school Art project planned for July which will provide us with some very attractive outdoor artwork.

We have been fortunate in having very low numbers of Covid infection this term and we are pleased that we have returned to business as normal finally within the school day. We very much hope to be able to invite parents back into school in the summer term and will look to starting with class Masses in the first instance. As soon as we feel it is wise to have everyone back into the Friday celebration assemblies, we will let you know.

We have reintroduced most of our regular activities now and the children have enjoyed library visits and class Masses in St Joseph's Parish Church as well as activities that are specific to year groups like swimming and clarinets. Next term we intend to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee with some events and we will send you information about these when we return from the Easter break. Please remember that there is an additional Bank Holiday to mark the Jubilee on Monday 6th June and so school will not be open on that day.

Thank you for your continued support of the school. On behalf of my colleagues and the governors, I would like to wish you all a happy and holy Easter.
